June is a time of change. For the younger members of our congregations, it tends to mean exams, before the end of another academic year. For some this will mean going up a year, the transition from Primary to Secondary School, or, perhaps, the end of school before going into work or onto further education. As one door closes, another opens. Within the Dover Town Benefice there is also the sense of a door closing and another opening. The Benefice is in process of being signed off by the Diocese to enable the appointment of a Team Rector, while Rev. Catherine leaves later this month to go to begin her new ministry at The St Laurence-In-Thanet Benefice (Licensing Wednesday 10th July at 7pm). We wish her well and thank her for her hard work since her appointment as The Interim Team Rector.

The door opens with Rev. Melissa moving from St Martin's to Charlton and Buckland, with Rev. Claire being licensed at St Martin's in August. The individual Parochial Church Councils and the wider Benefice Forum have already got things moving regarding the appointment of a new Rector.

Please pray for Rev. Catherine, Rev. Melissa and Rev. Claire as they prepare for their new roles and for the person who God calls to apply to be the new Rector. While we face another Interregnum (the second in four years), we know what we're about. There is a wealth of experience across the Benefice and beyond. Within the Benefice there are Clergy, Readers and Authorised Lay Ministers who can provide pastoral help and support.

The last few years have demonstrated the value of the Benefice – where we are able to support each other's endeavours. The importance is to look forward, prayerfully. Our prayers may not be answered in the way that we expect. Our prayers will be answered in the way that God wants. It is his will that will be done - not ours. In the words of William Cowper, 'God moves in a mysterious way, his wonders to perform'.

News from Charlton Fine Arts

On Sunday 5th May, an audience of about 60 was treated to a performance that would have earned accolades in the West End or Broadway. The superb duo Penelope Turner and Helen Crayford performed music of Kurt Weill and his contemporaries (1920s -1950s) with enormous skill and panache. Crayford's technical virtuosity and Turner's compelling voice and dramatic skill made this a thrilling show that commanded our attention from start to finish.

Cheers rang out after their first number, <u>Cabaret</u>, and often thereafter. <u>Mack the Knife, September and Youkali</u> were perhaps the most familiar to the audience, but less known numbers - for example, <u>Tell me the Truth about Love</u> (Auden/Britten) and <u>Hotel</u> (Apollinaire/Poulenc) were greeted enthusiastically. Crayford's spectacular solo items, <u>The Man I Love, I</u> <u>Got Rhythm and Tango Ballade</u>, gave us the chance to enjoy the piano at its best, with lid raised, and to appreciate her astonishing skill as a performer. It was hard to believe that the duo had rehearsed for the first time only the day before.

The audience were welcomed with a drink to take to their tables (Charlton Church was temporarily transformed into a Continental cafe or nightclub, with red and white check table cloths, fresh flowers on the tables and atmospheric lighting). The era was set by a few



well-chosen props: a Tiffany lamp and a fern on an elegant stand. Into this convivial atmosphere, the two glamorous performers, suitably attired for the 1920s, sequins and feathers included, brought an air of sophistication that transported us to a different time and place. Refreshments followed the performance and people stayed for at least another hour to enjoy each other's company.

Enormous thanks to Penelope and Helen for coming to perform in the Charlton Fine Arts Series, to Penelope's husband James, to Chris and Maggie Tyler and to Michael Parkinson, Shane and Vicki, for their stalwart support. Thanks also to Jonathan Eddolls from St Mary's Church for taking photographs, to Janet Dagys for helping with publicity and to Simon Partridge of Dover Community Radio for attending and interviewing Penelope. The programme for the second Charlton Fine Arts Series is under construction.
